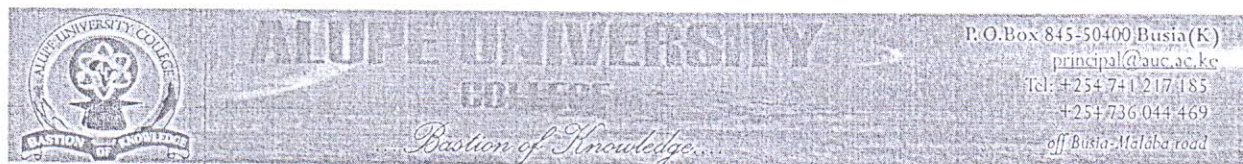

- b) Identify and classify the morphemes in the following words as either 'bound morpheme' or 'free morpheme':
  - i. Seaward
  - ii. Wastage
  - iii. Reconsider
  - iv. Unhealthy
  - v. Poetic
  - vi. Incompletion
  - vii. Modernize
  - viii. Waiter
  - ix. Keys (9 Marks)

**Question Two**

Bases, stems, and roots are morphological terms that form the main components of describing words in English. In this regard:

- b) Using illustrations, distinguish between:

  - ii. Independent root (4 marks)
- c) Each of the following words are made up of a base word with a suffix. Provide the base word without its added suffix.
- i. Sunny
  - ii. Loving
  - iii. Noisy
  - iv. Pumping
  - v. Fries (5 marks)
- d) Analyse the following words by identifying the root words and affixes
- i. Cryptic
  - ii. Actor
  - iii. Abnormal
  - iv. Cardiology
  - v. Hypnotism (5 marks)

### Question Three

- c) Using examples, describe the manifestation of the zero/null morpheme in the following grammatical presentations in English:

- i. Singular number of nouns (2 marks)
- ii. Plural (2 marks)
- iii. Past and past participle tense (2 marks)
